#### November Update

### The Beck Burn Wind Farm Community Fund

EDF Energy Renewables set up the fund to support local communities close to the Beck Burn Wind Farm.

There is £155,000 annually available.

ARTHURET PARISH COUNCIL CAN BID, LIKE ANY OTHER GROUP/ORGANISATION FOR GRANTS FOR SPECIFIC PROJECTS.

The fund is open to bids from all Community/Groups in the eligible Parish/Community councils.

This year we applied for funding for

**Phase 1 of the Border Reivers Heritage project** that will be based in the Council Rooms. We aim to provide a facility that celebrates the history of The Debatable Lands and give both local and visitors the opportunity to learn more, through visual displays and access to volunteers and computer software to research their family history. We received £4,000 towards this project.

### Dollies Brae play park

To renew the climbing frame/slide

This piece of play equipment needs replacing.

We applied for  $\pm 7,748$  and received  $\pm 3,211$  towards this project. The clerk is currently applying for funding to cover the full cost.

As well as the parish council benefitting with the above projects, a number of other groups/organisations in the parish have also received grants. Details of these can be confirmed on Cumbria Community Foundations website in the near future. Once these are made available to the clerk to publicise an update will be added to the parish council's website.

20% of the amount, £31,050, is ring fenced to fund EDF priorities to support Education and Training.

The Community Fund Advisory Panel comprised of a representative from each of the parish/community councils who will benefit, recommend the priorities for the fund and agree what grant applications are supported.

Arthuret Parish Councils representative on the panel is Cllr Gordon Routledge City Cllr Raynor Bloxham and County Cllr Val Tarbitt are also on the panel although neither have a vote.

Each of the 8 Parish//Community councils receive £5,000 annually to give grants to the local community organisations within their boundaries (with an upper limit of £1,000) agreed by Cumbria Community Foundation.

In this first year of receiving the £5,000 Arthuret Parish Council have, to date, given grants to the following.

Easton Village Hall Committee £600 Young person to help with sport travel costs £300 Longtown W.I. £350 1<sup>st</sup> Longtown Rainbows £150 Eskdale House £150 Virginia Lodge £150 Longtown Brownies £150 Longtown Bowling Club £250 Longtown Army Cadets £150 Longtown Primary School Breakfast Club £200 Saturday and Sunday Football teams £300 each of which £500 pays for cleaning the changing rooms annually The aim this year was to support as many local groups as we could. ### <u>Play areas</u>

As part of the Planning conditions Oakmere Homes, the developers of the Sawmill site housing, have paid a sum of £15,000 to the Parish Council. This sum of money is towards provision of play equipment at the play area between Old Road and Lochinvar Close. The quotes we have received have given an estimated cost in the region of £37,000 to renew the play area. This park was taken over by the Parish Council from Carlisle City Council (their plan was to remove it and the parish didn't want to see Longtown lose play provision.) This area needs tidied up and we are hopeful that in the longer term we can also build a Multi-Use Games Area back on the existing courts. Planning permission for 100 homes between Old Road and Briar Lea Court will bring funding from Gleeson, the developers, to provide play facilities. This will be open to the community to comment and give us their ideas once we know when we will be likely to receive this money.

The Parish Council agreed with Riverside Housing to take over their 3 play areas, Moor Crescent, Raefield and The Square otherwise they were to be removed. The legal agreement was signed in May and we are awaiting Riversides confirmation that his is finalised.

The Multi Use Games Area in the car park of the old Lochinvar School site is now owned by William Howard Trust. Before Longtown Primary School changed over the MUGA was available to use in the community, most of you will be aware this is no longer open to use outside school hours.

### **CCTV** Cameras

Taking on board representation from a member of the public at a Parish Council meeting earlier this year, the Parish Council agreed in principle to look at the practicalities of getting 2 CCTV cameras reinstated in Longtown. We have been in discussion with providers and now have quotes, although in the early stages, we are progressing and looking to secure the funding to take this forward.

### Turbine transportation

The final transportation of the blades for the wind turbines to Hallburn will be on Sunday 19<sup>th</sup> November. The bus shelter on English Street will be reinstated and the temporary one removed soon after. The works in Swan Street to reinstate the road and tree works will be postponed until after the Christmas period. The reason for this is the upheaval it will

create for businesses and locals in the lead up to Christmas as there will need to be temporary traffic lights in place over a period of a week.

Parish Councillors commit their time and work for the parish with no payment, it is voluntary.

# Hallburn Wind Farm Community Fund

There is £66,000 annually available to bid through Grantscape who manage the funding on behalf of REG Windpower.

Arthuret Parish Council is one of 5 parishes eligible to apply for funding.

Arthuret, Kirkandrews on Esk, Heathersgill, Kirklinton Middle and Westlinton are the parishes who can benefit.

Each of the parishes have 1 nominated representative, along with the County and City Councillors elected to the area these make up the Advisory Panel who consider the grant applications and decide whether or not the bid is supported. All members of the panel have a vote. Arthuret Parish Council representative is Cllr Sir James Graham with Cllr Gordon Routledge as reserve.

There are 2 panel meetings each year to agree grants. The first one was held in October when 50% of this year's funding was allocated.

# Enhance festive lights displays applied for £3,327 received £2,000

The solar powered hanging trees on the lamp posts along the main street are part of this funding. The original bid was for 2 trees per lamp column, as we did not receive the entire grant we have had to scale down the project. In addition the Parish Council will be planting 4 foot trees in each of the 4 flower beds at the centre of the town that will be lit up.
